Gospel Reflection:

When John speaks of Jesus being lifted up on the Cross, he refers to more than Jesus' death. This lifting up is the whole story of Jesus coming from and returning to his father: life, death, being raised from the tomb, being exalted over the whole world. The reference to the serpent Moses raised in the desert happened when the Israelites, bitten by serpents as a result of their grumbling in the desert, were cured by looking on the image of their woundedness. In the same way, Jesus has taken on our humanity and will bring healing and eternal life through his death and glorification. The very life and love of God can be seen and touched in the only Son, lifted up for us.
